About this form

The National Vocational Education and Training Regulator (the Regulator) accredits and regulates courses for delivery by registered training organisations (RTOs) under the National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011 (NVR Act). The Regulator is the person appointed to make decisions under the National Vocational Education and Training Regulator Act 2011 (NVR Act), and is also known as the Chief Executive Officer of the Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA).

The Standards for VET Accredited Courses 2021 apply to the design of VET accredited courses and require VET accredited courses be based on an established industry, education, legislative, enterprise or community need. The Standards for VET Accredited Courses 2021 require courses be developed in consultation with, and validated by, industry, enterprise, community and/or professional groups.

If you intend to make an application for renewal of accreditation of a course, you must first complete this form and submit to the ASQA, with details about the ongoing need for national recognition of a course. This information will be considered by the Regulator in its determination of whether the course continues to meet eligibility requirements for accreditation as required in sections 1 – 4 before you commence any detailed review and course redevelopment.

The ASQA will provide feedback on the VET accredited course - intention to renew within 20 working days of receipt of the completed form and payment of the lodgement fee.

The Application for course accreditation (renewal) must be received by ASQA on or before 90 days prior to course expiry. It is recommended the Application for course accreditation (renewal) is submitted 6 months prior to expiry to enable the application to be assessed and RTOs to gain registration for delivery.
