Why have I received a notice of intent?

The Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA) has cancelled the registration of International Institute of Education and Training Pty Ltd (IJET, trading as EDU VET 40993). The cancellation took effect from 21 November 2024 and was published on training.gov.au.

As a result of the cancellation of the registration, ASQA is now commencing a process to issue notices of intent to cancel qualifications issued by IJET from January 2023.

What happens next?

What does the Notice of Intent to cancel my qualification mean?

ASQA has not made a decision about your qualification yet. The Notice of Intent is the first step in the process to consider the validity of your qualification. The notice advises you that ASQA considers your qualification(s) issued to you by IJET should be cancelled for the reasons outlined in the notice. You now have an opportunity to tell ASQA why your qualifications should not be cancelled and provide evidence in support.

How much time do I have to respond?

If you decide to respond to the Notice of Intent, you must do so within the period specified in the notice, i.e. **no later than 7pm (AEDT) 7 days after receiving the written notice dated 26 November 2024** if you have any of the following qualifications from IJET:

Your Notice also specifies the due date of your response to ASQA.

ASQA will consider your response before it makes a decision on whether or not to cancel your qualification(s).

How do I provide evidence to ASQA to respond to the Notice of Intent?

ASQA has created a secure electronic form on its website which will allow you to lodge your response and any evidence. Please use the link provided in the Notice to [submit your response](#).

What type of evidence would be considered?

If you have information and/or evidence that you undertook valid training and assessment and can demonstrate achieving the learning outcomes or competencies required, you should provide this to ASQA.

Your response and evidence must:

- Demonstrate that ILET provided you with appropriate training and/or assessment; **and**
- Responses must be supported by evidence as outlined in the table below:

What happens if I don't provide a response?

If you decide not to respond to the Notice of Intent, ASQA will cancel your relevant qualification(s). ASQA will provide you a notice of its cancellation decision via email.

What happens if I provide a response after the period specified in the notice?

If you do not respond by the due date, ASQA may cancel your qualification.

What happens after I respond to the Notice of Intent with evidence?

ASQA will review the information you provide before making a decision.

ASQA will provide you a notice of its decision after it has reviewed the evidence and information you have provided. ASQA will notify you via email.

What if I disagree with ASQA's decision to cancel my qualification?

You have the right to have the decision reviewed. See above for more information on the review process and you will receive further information about your appeal rights if ASQA decides to cancel your qualification(s).

What should I do next?

The first step is to use the link in the Notice to provide information and evidence. You can also access the response form on [ASQA's website](#).

I am an overseas student with an IJET qualification, will this affect my visa?

The first step is to use the link in the Notice to provide information and evidence. You can also access the response form on [ASQA's website](#). It is important you reply to the Notice and within the specified period.

IJET was not registered to deliver qualifications to overseas students so your current student visa and course of study will not be impacted. If you have used the cancelled qualification(s) and/or statements of attainment to gain entry into your current course of study, you should contact the Department of Home Affairs.

Do I need to tell my employer?

The first step is to use the link in the Notice to provide information and evidence. You can also access the response form on [ASQA's website](#). It is important you reply to the Notice and within the specified period as ASQA has not yet made a decision about your qualification.

You should consider telling your employer that you are engaging with ASQA in this process if your qualification(s):

- is/are required for you to undertake your role
- was/were presented to your employer for you to be appointed to your role

Can I get a refund on the cost of getting my qualification with IJET?

I am not sure I have the necessary Recognised Prior Learning (RPL) for qualification, what can I do?

If you have now gained the relevant experience in industry, you could undertake an RPL assessment with another RTO.

What happens after the review?

ASQA will notify you of the outcome of its decision and provide you with information on the next steps.

If a decision is made to cancel my qualification, what happens then?

You will be required to return your qualification(s) to ASQA.

It is important you return the qualification(s) to ASQA. You may incur a penalty if you do not comply. ASQA will advise you in writing, as part of the decision notice, when and how to do this.

If you continue to use your qualification(s) ASQA may take further action and penalties apply.

ASQA will notify the Office of the Student Identifiers Registrar. They manage the register that holds each individual's Unique Student Identifier (USI) Record.

What options do I have to get appropriate qualifications?

You could undertake a Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) assessment with another provider. RPL may be based on evidence collected through formal, non-formal and informal learning to determine the extent to which a person has achieved the required learning and/or competency outcomes to be awarded a unit of credit; this is often matched with 'gap' training, to meet the full competency requirements of a unit or course.

Formal learning, as the term relates to RPL, may mean units of credit which are related, but not equivalent to, the credit being sought, or credits which are no longer current.

Non-formal learning refers to learning, which is structured and focused, but which is delivered outside the Australian Qualifications Framework; for example, seminars, continuous professional development activities, and non-accredited training.

Informal learning refers to learning which is gained without syllabus or curriculum without any formal or non-formal direction – in the vocational sector this often relates to skills acquired through the workplace, which have not been directed by an instructor or structured to lead to a recognised outcome.

You can provide a variety of documentation. This includes, but is not limited to:

- records of previously completed training
- assessment items
- assessment records and/or
- declarations from a student's employer

You can also speak with your employer about training opportunities.

Am I entitled to a credit transfer?

A qualification is no longer valid if it is cancelled, so you would not be able to seek a credit transfer.
