The Australian Skills Quality Authority (ASQA) has cancelled the qualifications and/or statements of attainment of more than 6000 former students of International Institute of Education and Training Pty Ltd (IIET, trading as EDU VET 40993) as part of its ongoing program of regulatory action.

Updated statement of regulatory action

IIET was registered to deliver to domestic students and was not funded by government to deliver VET qualifications.

An ASQA compliance investigation found it had issued qualifications without appropriate training or competency-based assessment by qualified assessors through a model of full recognition of prior learning.

Given the nature of the issues identified in this matter, and to ensure public safety, ASQA issued notices of intent to cancel qualifications and/or statements of attainment to 6818 former IIET students who had an opportunity to respond to ASQA before any decision was made.

Of the 6818 former students who were sent notices, more than 6000 did not provide a response within the designated timeframe. As a result, ASQA has today cancelled their qualifications and/or statements of attainment.

ASQA has received responses from more than 700 former students and is considering their responses. ASQA will advise those individuals of an outcome as soon as possible.

The affected former students of IIET collectively hold a variety of qualifications across individual support, disability, aged care and community services and first aid.

ASQA continues to work collaboratively with other government agencies and state and territory governments and regulators in relation to the impact of this action and other qualification cancellation decisions on former students, as well as any workplaces affected.

ASQA is committed to lifting quality and integrity across the VET sector and the integrity of our qualifications is a primary focus. There is no place for any provider who seeks to undermine the sector or exploit students.

These decisions are part of an ongoing program of regulatory action supported by ASQA's strengthened capacity to target illegal behaviour and non-genuine providers that threaten the integrity of VET.
